Dear Parents/Carers,

As we approach Easter and the end of the term, once again the school calendar begins to fill with school and community events.

HARMONY DAY

This week we will celebrate Harmony Week. Harmony Day allows us to celebrate the cultural diversity of our communities in NSW Public Schools. This year's theme is 'Everyone Belongs'. Harmony Day assists us to reaffirm the inclusive nature of public schools, build intercultural understanding and belonging, and oppose racism. We are very fortunate to have a performance taking place by Kirrawee High School's African Drumming Group on Thursday and we'd like to thank the students and staff at Kirrawee HS for their support of our special Harmony Day activities. Students will also have the opportunity to rotate to 6 classrooms learning about the culture of various nations. Students will have their 'passports' stamped as they move to each classroom's country and are able to participate in themed activities based on the designated country. Students are invited to wear orange or their 'cultural dress' on Thursday 21st March to celebrate the day.

On Thursday 28th March Kirrawee Public School will celebrate Easter with an 'Easter Hat or That' Parade. STRATEGIC IMPROVEMENT PLAN 2024-2027

As Kirrawee PS participated in External Validation (EV) last year to evaluate the previous Strategic Improvement Plan (SIP) we are now working on our next 4-year Strategic Improvement Plan 2024-2027. As a result of our work in this area looking at data from our external validation and considering directions for the next 4 years, the staff



have set the following areas as core business for our next SIP;

- Student growth & attainment

ATTENDANCE

As mentioned in previous correspondence from the school, Kirrawee PS, along with all other NSW Public Schools, values strong attendance. The expected rate of attendance for students at NSW Public Schools is 90%, however we, and many other schools with high expectations for attendance, strive for 95% attendance. Recently some letters were sent to parents/carers if their child's attendance has dropped below 85%. This may include absences that have been explained as either leave, sick etc, however, the letter is to notify you as parents/carers that their current rate of attendance is below our expected threshold. Please don't be alarmed if you received a letter, no further action is needed. For students whose attendance remains below our threshold as we move throughout the year, regular monitoring and support systems will be implemented so that the school and home can work together to encourage regular attendance.

OPPORTUNITY CLASS PLACEMENTS

Parents/carers there have been some changes to the Opportunity Class structure with NSW Department of Education looking at ways to ensure that opportunity classes are in the right locations to equitably support high potential and gifted students. As a result, the NSW Department of Education will reduce the number of opportunity class places at some schools that are near or over their enrolment capacity and establish classes at schools that are under enrolment capacity. This will be effective from 2025. There will be no change to the overall number of opportunity class places available. Should you require more information about this process, please don't hesitate to reach out to the school.






Stage 1 Report

Stage 1 has been exploring the world of 2D shapes.

Students recently engaged in some hands-on activities to represent 2D shapes. Students were then able to search for real life objects that match their shape that they created with chalk and skipping ropes. These



activities reinforced to students the concepts of 2D shapes, sides and vertices in a fun and interactive way.

During music lessons, Stage 1 has been learning the musical foundations of rhythm and notes. They are understanding how rhythm assists them with developing a sense of timing and coordination. Students are beginning to apply their knowledge of musical notes in order to play melodies and harmonies on their instruments.

We have been really impressed with the work ethic of Stage 2 students over the last couple of weeks. As part of our mathematics program, we have been practising measuring different objects and distances around the school. This has been a really engaging experience for students as it involves a lot of hands-on activities. Here you can see some of the 3/4H students collaboratively building a tower that they estimate is one metre tall. They were also problem-solving while trying to find three objects in the classroom that could be placed end-to-end to make a total length of 25cm.

Stage 3 has been hard at work! All teachers would like to congratulate the students who completed their Naplan assessments this week.

Thursday this week we had Harmony day, which is a celebration of our cultural diversity – a day of cultural respect for everyone who calls Australia home. Students were asked to wear a piece of clothing from their cultural background or the colour orange to help celebrate our differences.

In the classroom, we are hard at work:

- In Literacy we are starting our new unit 'A bright new world'. Students will be analysing the text 'bright new world' and 'dry to dry' as they explore genre books.
- In Maths, we have been focussing on units of measurements and applying their knowledge of place value to convert between units.
- Our Theme Unit this term is "Ethics & Emotions". Students will be learning about puberty in the coming weeks to aid their understanding of who they are and what they value in order to prepare them for physical and emotional changes that they will experience.

Also on the night, we'll ask for 2 - 4 dads to act as liaisons for the Fathering Project Kirrawee School Community. More details will be shared on the night.



Behaviour code for students

Information for students and parents or carers

NSW public schools are committed to providing safe, supportive, and responsive learning environments for everyone across a range of settings. We teach and model the inclusive and safe behaviours we value in our students.

In NSW public schools students are expected, to the best of their ability, to:

- show respect to other students, their teachers and school staff and community members
- follow school and class rules and follow the directions of their teachers
- strive for the highest standards in learning
- act in a courteous and respectful way that makes all members of the school community feel valued, included and supported
- resolve conflict respectfully, calmly and fairly
- meet the school's agreed uniform policy or dress code
- attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- respect all property
- be safe and not be violent or bring weapons, illegal drugs, alcohol, vapes, e-cigarettes or tobacco into our schools
- not bully, harass, intimidate, or discriminate against anyone in our schools.

Schools take action in response to behaviour that is detrimental to self or others or to the achievement of high-quality teaching and learning.

All students have a right to:

- safety at school
- access and fully participate in their learning
- be treated with respect by other students, teachers and school staff
- express their views, set goals and selfadvocate.

The principal and school staff, using their professional judgment, are best placed to maintain discipline and provide safe, supportive and responsive learning environments and apply an appropriate action when students are not meeting these expectations. The department is responsible for the provision of a policy framework and resources such as legal issues bulletins, access to specialist advice, and professional learning to guide principals and their staff in exercising their professional judgment. In this context, the NSW Government and the Department of Education will back the authority and judgment of principals and school staff at the local level.

Behaviour code for students: Student actions

Promoting the inclusion, learning, wellbeing, and safety of all students in NSW public schools is a high priority for the Department of Education.

We implement teaching and learning approaches across a range of settings to support the development of skills needed by students to meet our high standards for respectful, safe and engaged behaviour.

To meet the expectations set out above, students in NSW public schools, to the best of their ability, should adhere to the following principles.

Respect

- Treat one another with dignity.
- Communicate and behave courteously.
- Act and work cooperatively with other students, teachers, and school staff.
- Develop positive and respectful relationships.
- Value the interests, ability and culture of others.
- Respect the learning needs of other students.
- Dress appropriately by wearing the agreed school uniform or dress code.
- Take care with school property and the property of staff and other students.

Safety

- Model and follow school and class rules and expectations around behaviour and conduct.
- Negotiate and resolve conflict.
- Be aware of and take responsibility for how their behaviour and actions impact others.
- Care for self and others.
- Be safe and help others to make safe choices that do not hurt themselves or others.

Engagement

- Arrive at school and class on time.
- Be prepared for every lesson.
- Actively participate in learning.
- Aspire and strive to achieve the highest standards of learning.
