EARLY STAGE 1 REPORT

We are having our classroom carpets professionally steam cleaned in Week 7 so we are taking full advantage of being able to get ours messy beforehand by using it as a giant blackboard for mathematics!

We have been working on dividing or sharing items into equal groups to help us understand division and multiplication. We have divided teddies, blocks counters, marbles, pop sticks and children into equal groups. We have also been practising our skip counting by 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s as it can be more efficient to count this way than counting by 1s.

We have also learnt that putting items into arrays (rows) makes it easier to visualise our groups. This work is all foundational to understanding multiplication (or repeated addition... 2 + 2 + 2 = 6 or 3 groups of 2 = 6) and division.

Unfortunately, restrictions and other school commitments have meant we were unable to arrange a Kindergarten excursion this year. We promise that the Stage One teachers will make it up to you next year!




Sustainable group Charopy came by to install the new technology to the school this week. The bin operates with a scanner on the lid that provides a green or red light notifying the students if their piece of rubbish can go in the specific bin. The school is then able to gain valuable data from the Charopy website via their login with the specific data detailing the items collected in the bin. It provides a graph with which types of rubbish have been collected being able to further inform the school on how their waste is being managed.

The Smart bin is a welcome addition and reaffirms the schools commitment to being green.
