Principal's Message

Dear Parents/Carers.

Our classes and students are very much settled now, and our students are in routine with new learning initiatives taking place in each stage. We thank you, as parents, for your support of the school and for ensuring that your children are coming to school prepared and ready to learn. School, and education, truly is a collaborative process with a common goal for student success, and we value your partnership in this process.

As you would have seen in our other correspondence, we have our Parent Teacher Interviews taking place in Week 5. I urge all families to take up this opportunity to meet with your child's class teacher to familiarise yourself with them, see the classroom, ask any questions about the year ahead and to provide much valued feedback, from you, as parents/carers about your child.

Parent Teacher Interviews are a great platform to communicate some background about your child, whether it be socially, physically, academically, emotionally etc. We are committed to working in partnership with our parents and carers to support your child in their learning journey. We are also offering a complimentary afternoon tea for those parents who can spare some time before or after their scheduled timeslot so that you may have the opportunity to meet other parents at the school to establish school networks and become a part of the Kirrawee Community.

A reminder for our Year 3 and Year 5 families that NAPLAN assessments will be taking place between 13th - 25th March. During this time students in Year 3 and Year 5 will sit the National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy. Students will sit a Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language and Numeracy assessment. All assessments will be conducted online, except for Year 3 Writing which will be conducted on paper. An information flyer has been sent to families, however, should you require further information please don't hesitate to reach out to your child's teacher.



For our Year 6 families, please be aware that the High School Expression of Interest is once again an online process. This process will take place from Week 6. As already advised, if you would like a paper copy of the High School Expression of Interest, please just contact the school.

We would like to thank all the parents who have engaged the Therapist in School meetings recently. We are committed to working through this process in a timely manner and supporting your child's educational journey with shared learning goals. We thank you for your patience as we engage the new policy and guidelines.

As mentioned in the earlier newsletter this year, Kirrawee PS is now using School Bytes as our preferred method of communication for our families. Audiri (formerly Skool Bag) has been replaced by School Bytes and this will be the channel by which we communicate to our families. If you have not already downloaded the School Bytes Parent Portal App we encourage you to do so, so that you can stay connected with updates and school information.

I sent a recent letter to the school community advising the importance of regular school attendance. The NSW Department of Education's expected rate of attendance for all students is 90% with many schools striving for attendance rates of 95%. There are times when absences cannot be avoided, such as when your child is sick, and we understand that fact. However, the statistics around casual in-attendance are quite alarming. Did you know that if your child misses as little as 1 day per fortnight, they will miss 4 weeks of school per year, which adds up to over 1 year missed over their school life.

As part of our Attendance Policy we regularly review our students attendance rates and will notify you when they drop below our expected threshold. Please take this as an opportunity to assess where improvements around promoting attendance can be made. We are committed to encouraging regular school attendance and working with you in this process.

Our stage 1 students are settling into their class routines and learning programs. This week was the commencement of the new home learning booklets. Students revise the previous weeks spelling phonemes/graphemes, as well as practise their speed skills in adding and subtracting numbers (MathsOnline). 


Stage 2 Report

Stage 2 have been studying a literacy unit, in line with the new NSW English Syllabus. It is based on the book 'Fantastic Mr Fox' by Roald Dahl. Students are studying elements of narrative writing such as:

- understanding the expectations of a narrative
- visualising richly created characters
- creating vivid characters
- determining character traits
- identifying problems that drive a narrative
- building tensions and suspense in a narrative





We have studied the structure and orientation of a narrative piece, observing the importance of character and setting.

We have examined the use of adjectives (quantifying, descriptive and classifying) and adverbs to enhance

character description and aid visualisation. We have observed the ways in which character traits, dialogue and vocabulary are used to create a rich picture in the mind of the reader. Using this knowledge, students are constructing their own vivid character descriptions as a basis for their narrative pieces.

Stage 3 Report

Stage 3 is off and running into the New Year!

In the classroom, we are hard at work:

- In Literacy we are studying the book "The Wild Robot", which is the story of Roz, a newly manufactured robot who becomes a castaway on an island with no human inhabitants. Students will be learning how to write a narrative and create their own Sci-Fi story.
- In Maths, we have been focussing on Place Value up to millions and we will be looking at addition and subtraction strategies over the coming weeks.
- Our Theme Unit this term is "Ethics & Emotions". We have been looking at ethical dilemmas and how to make good choices.
- We will also be preparing Year 5 for NAPLAN, holding practice tests in Week 5.



We had an exciting visit from some Cronulla Sharks players who spoke to the students about being "Simply YOUR Best" - as opposed to "Simple THE BEST"!

In the coming weeks, Year 6 will be recognised at the Year 6 Leaders Ceremony and Stage 3 will have a visit from Kirrawee High School Leaders who will talk to the students about what's on offer at the school and conduct small group sessions about resilience, respect and responsibility.
