### Principal's Message

Dear Parents/Carers,

Here we are in week 10 already! It does appear, once again, that the term has passed us by in an instant.

### **EASTER HAT & THAT PARADE/RAFFLE/OPEN CLASSROOMS**

Last Thursday we welcomed our parents, grandparents and friends of KPS to our classrooms and to see the 'Easter Hat and That' Parade. The day was a huge success and we estimated that we had close to 400 visitors to our school on the day. It was great to see so many of our KPS community engage with the opportunity to visit the school and to see the wonderful work that takes place here.

Once again I would like to thank our parents and carers for their generous support of the Easter Raffle and the Year 6 Cake Stall. Thank you to the families that donated items for both events. As a result of your immense generosity our Year 6 students have had a tremendous start to their fundraising efforts for the year and were able to raise the following funds;

- We had \$800 of online sales for the Easter Raffle and Year 6 sold an additional \$400 of sales on the day for the raffle.
- Year 6 raised \$1000 at the Y6 Cake Stall.

We are overwhelmed by the response from our families, and, to 'kick-off' the year with \$2 200 in our Year 6 fundraising pot is a sensational achievement! We thank you deeply for your support of the school.

### JUST LIKE YOU INCURSION

This week our students in Years 1-6 participated in an incursion 'Just Like You'. 'Just Like You' is a free, evidence-based and curriculum-aligned disability awareness program delivered by <u>Variety – the</u>



<u>Children's Charity</u> and led by facilitators with lived experience of disability. The program builds understanding, acceptance and support between students with or without a disability through teaching inclusive language and accessible design.

It was held on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> April which was also World Autism Awareness Day. Kirrawee PS is committed to raising awareness of disability and promoting acceptance and understanding.

### PLAYGROUND INSTALLATION

Construction work will commence on the K-2 fixed play equipment shortly. The old fixed-equipment has been dismantled and weather permitting, we should see the development of the new equipment over the coming weeks. We anticipate it to be completed before the end of the holiday period. We thank you for your patience as this work takes place.

### **SCHOOL UNIFORM**

I would like to take this opportunity to commend students and their families for their adherence to the KPS School Uniform Policy. It is wonderful to see so many students in full school uniform. As the weather begins to cool over the coming months, it is important that your child has a jumper/jacket that is labelled with their name to assist school staff in returning misplaced belongings.

### STUDENT LEARNING PLANS

A notification via School Bytes Parent Portal will be sent this week to all families. This notification provides information for parents with how to access, and, either approve or request changes, to learning plans that your child's class teacher has written. Please note that this correspondence is intended only for parents with children who may require support to access the curriculum which will already have been discussed with you.



### PROVIDING TIME TO SWITCH OFF

Parents/carers may have seen communication recently about providing time to switch off for our teachers. The NSW Department of Education has introduced this measure to assist in setting expectations for digital communication to help address staff shortages by protecting staff against burnout and to promote staff wellbeing.

We recognise that communicating and engaging with parents is critical to effective partnerships and learning outcomes, and different schools and communities will have different engagement expectations.

We want you to know you can still contact KPS at times that suit you best, however, teachers may not reply to non-emergency messages or emails outside of school operating hours. Under normal circumstances, staff should respond to queries within 2 school days.

We're thrilled to share some of their stunning artwork with you. Take a moment to admire their creativity and dedication as they continue to grow as artists!




# **Stage 3 Report**

Do you know how to prepare for a flood or storm? Do you know what to do when a flood or storm occurs? Every flood is different, and floods can change quickly. Significant floods will happen again and may even be greater than those experienced or behave differently than those in the past. Knowing the flood potential of where you live is important to keep yourself, your family and others safe during floods.

It is important to understand the local risks, consequences and timings to act on warnings issued by the NSW SES to ensure your safety and the safety of your family, households, friends, neighbours, pets and businesses. One of the most important things you can do is have an emergency plan. Click here to create your Home or Business Emergency Plan.

Visit the NSW SES flood information pages and SES storm information pages to find out what you can do before, during and after floods and storms, including:

- · Having a home or business flood plan
- Having an Emergency Kit or Go Bag
- . Knowing the flood heights that will trigger property protection and/or evacuation actions
- Knowing where to go if you need to evacuate
- Planning for animals

# Get your students Ready!

#### Make emergency education a part of your school

The NSW State Emergency Service (NSW SES) offers a range of free educational in-school visits available to primary school students at all levels.

### Being prepared!

NSW SES recognises the importance of communicating our key safety messages to a young audience. This gives our whole community the best chance of being properly prepared in an emergency situation and being prepared can make all the difference during an emergency.

#### Presentations

NSW SES volunteers can deliver one of three interactive presentations that cover the topics of floods, storms or general emergency preparedness with an optional extension on tsunami. Each topic is tailored to suit varying age levels and runs for approximately 30-45 minutes.

#### FloodSafe

This presentation looks at some of the yucky and dangerous things you might find in floodwater, as well as important safety information about floods.

### StormSafe

This presentation takes a closer look at some of the exciting and dangerous aspects of a storm including hall, flash flooding and lightning. It also includes simple tips on how you can look after your pets during a storm and prepare your house before the storm hits.

### Emergency Ready

This presentation contains information on all types of emergencies (storm, flood, earthquake etc.) and what steps you need to take to plan for different emergencies such as putting together an emergency kit.
